- 1) SPECIAL GUEST: T from Neighborhood Services visited our meeting and spoke with us for the first thirty minutes about potential ideas for partnership between the City's office of Neighborhood Services and the History Project. We brainstormed a bunch of good ideas and vowed to continue the conversation moving forward.
- 2) ONGOING INITIATIVES
 - a. ARCHIVES
 - i. Update: TC is new high school volunteer who will be scanning in historic newspapers from our archives, c. 1990-1995, on a weekly basis; GSR's new research fellow at RC will do the other end of the process of uploading the scans into our digital archive. The goal is to complete digitization of all c. 1990-1995 newsletters by May 2020.

TRANZMISSION PRISON PROJECT: NM brought up the idea of donating our extra copies of books in the library to the Tranzmission Prison Project, based in Asheville, NC, which coordinates getting LGBTQ-themed books to incarcerated LGBTQ people around the country. They particularly need cis gay male and trans-themed books.
 - 1. GSR will write up an open letter to the community announcing our intention to donate our overflow cis gay male (and any overflow trans) books to the Tranzmission project.
 - 2. Meanwhile, GSR will also create an Amazon wish list of the books that the Library team previously said we wanted to add to the library, and then encourage community members to purchase those books
