### **Meeting Minutes**

#### 1) ARCHIVES

- a) New Roanoke College research assistant started in September
- b) New graduate-level (MLIS) intern from Old Dominion University also started in September
  - i) digitization updates will proceed with digitizing MCC newsletter from the 1990s; not sure what to digitize next (will work with intern on this)
  - ii) Potential intern projects: creating a subject index for the *BRLP*, and possibly other digitized newsletters; possibly creating online / social media content

## 2) ORAL HISTORIES

- a) KS update on interview?
  - i) Transcript is almost done; future interviews will focus on working-class lesbian histories
- b) Next community oral history workshop unclear whether this will happen due to the situation at Roanoke College

#### 3) PODCAST

- a) Possible Fall 2023 semester project (Episode 6) on LGBTQ housing and homelessness - GSR
  - i) Podcast launch event on World AIDS Day (Dec 1)?

#### 4) WALKING TOURS

- a) Videos highlighting the Market area and Elmwood Park stops on the Downtown tour - they turned out great! - KS
  - i) Have JM cross-post content on TikTok
  - ii) KS Salem Ave tour reel update? filmed but needs to be edited
- b) tour guide training & staffing update
  - i) KS will offer tour guide training in March
  - ii) KS will lead one tour a month in 2024 from March to November. There will be no special bump in tours for Pride Month
  - iii) Let's finalize the 2024 tour schedule by December
  - v) We agreed to cancel the upcoming November 2023 tour
- c) Downtown tour revisions email KS the tour script
- d) Charging \$ for private tours this is now "live" on our website
- 5) TRANS WELLNESS FUND

- a) Summer round of applications is over! Fall round is now open (deadline September 30th)
- b) Updates:
  - 17 applications received in summer round; 3 awarded; \$1,125 distributed; \$452 still in bank.
  - ii) 18 new applications received so far for the fall funding cycle (July 1 -Sep 30; decisions will be made in October/November)
- c) Donations:
  - i) From last meeting: we should have a meeting (or at next project meeting) to discuss the pros/cons of incorporating as a non-profit so as to have a bank account that can accept donations; or, to partner with an existing non-profit (such as LGBR) that can act as the financial steward of the fund (would entail meeting and signing some kind of agreement of cooperation with the History Project)

    - (2) Decision was made to reach out to LGBR about becoming a fiscal sponsor for the fund. GSR will speak with EJ to get that going. Will need to culminate in a written agreement signed by both parties.
